FRANCE BLEU AND THE 10/18 EDITION AWARDS FRANCOIS HENRI SOULIE FOR NOVEL ANGELUS

OVER DETECTIVE PRIZE

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USPA NEWS - François-Henri Soulie has been awarded FRANCE BLEU PRIZE - GREAT DETECTIVES section, by FRANCE BLEU and EDITIONS 10/18 or his novel ANGELUS, Jean-Emmanuel Casalta, Director of France Bleu, chaired the jury was made up of 13 listeners and 12 listeners selected from among the 5,000 applications submitted on francebleu.fr, the portal site of the 44 branches of France Bleu, two facilitators, an editor in chef and three communicators from France Bleu. ANGELUS is in the line of abbey thrillers (Umberto Eco, Peter Tremayne!). This novel adds a reflection on fanaticism to a large romantic fresco and a real detective plot through medieval Occitania of 1165! 2 abbeys, 2 days, 2 crimes! Suspicion is on those who will soon be called the Cathars. The Church of Rome commissions a young investigator ... Many readers do not hesitate to point out a flattering connection between François-Henri Soulie and Umberto Eco, author of The Name of the Rose.

THE 1ST EDITION OF THE FRANCE BLEU PRIZE - GRANDS DETECTIVES LAUNCHED IN FEBRUARY 2020

The first edition of the FRANCE BLEU PRIZE - GRANDS DETECTIVES was launched in February 2020. It is also disrupted by the health crisis (COVID-19 outbreak) which notably prevented the awarding of the Prize initially scheduled for mid-June at the "Saint-Maur en Poche" trade fair. The Prix France Bleu - Grands Détectives is the second literary prize launched by France Bleu, after the Prix France Bleu - PAGE des Libraires 6 years ago.

These two prizes aim to promote pleasure reading.

He is also the author at 10/18 of a trilogy co-written with Thierry Bourcy, which takes us on a journey through Europe at the beginning of the 17th century: « Le Songe de l'astronome » (The Dream of the Astronomer), La Conspiration du Globe (The conspiracy of the globe) and « Ils ont tué Ravaillac » (They killed Ravaillac)

ABOUT FRANCE BLEU-----

France Bleu is the network of French local public radios, broken down into 44 general public proximity radios. It was created at the initiative of Jean-Marie Cavada, CEO of Radio France, in September 2000. The content is essentially made up of local programs from local stations in the regions and departments relayed in the evening, at night and at noon by a National program. It is part of the public group Radio France, in which it can be compared to France 3 within France Télévisions because of its local mission.
